Section 1

Removals to Out-of-Home Placement: Statewide

The data presented in Section 1 reflect an unduplicated count of all children/youth removed from home and entering a RI DCYF out-of-home placement during July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014. The data include children/youth in congregate care, specialized foster care, independent and semi-independent living, relative foster care, nonrelative foster care, and court ordered. The data presented in this report were pulled from the RI DCYF data system, RICHIST.

There were 1,319 children who entered out-of-home care in FY 2014. Of these, 1,136 children (86.1%) were first time entries and 183 children (13.9%) were re-entries. Re-entry is defined as entered within 12 months of a previous discharge from all placements. These figures may be slightly different from Federal Reports that report on a Federal Fiscal Year (October 1 to September 30 time periods).





Figure 1. Percent of children entering into out-of-home placement for the first time, by age group and frequent removal reasons, FY14





Figure 2. Percent of children re-entering into out-of-home placement, by age group and frequent removal reasons, FY14





Figure 3. Percent of children entering into out-of-home placement for the first time, by age group and most frequent first placement service types of current removal, FY14







Figure 6. Median length of time (days) since previous discharge for children re-entering into out-of-home placement, by age group (N=183), FY14



Section 2

Removals to Out-of-Home Placement: Network-wide

The data presented in Section 2 reflect an unduplicated count of youth removed from home and entering a placement assigned to a Network at the time of removal, July 1, 2013 – June 30, 2014. This includes children/youth removed from home and entering into congregate care, specialized foster care, independent and semi-independent living assigned to a Network and their siblings placed in relative foster care, nonrelative foster care, court ordered. Children assigned to network community-based services at the time of removal are also included in this section.

Children who were removed from home and their initial placement was in relative foster care, nonrelative foster care or other placement not included in list above, are not reflected in this data. For example, if a child was removed from home and placed in a foster family setting and then transitioned into a congregate care setting, their entry into the Networks of care would not be reflected in this data. If a child re-entered DCYF care and was discharged from a placement within 12 months and that previous placement was included in the Network, the child is reflected in this data.

There were 935 children who entered an out-of-home placement with an initial placement into congregate care, specialized foster care, independent or semi-independent living (and their siblings) assigned to the networks in FY 2014, including those assigned to network community-based services. Of these, 771 (82.5%) were first time entries and 164 (17.5%) were re-entries. Re-entry is defined as entered within 12 months of a previous discharge from all placements

<u>NOTE</u>: It is expected that the percentage of Network-wide re-entries would be higher than non-network re-entries because children/youth in congregate care traditionally have a higher rate of re-entry than children/youth in foster care. In FY12, prior to the SOC Network implementation, the percentage of re-entries into congregate care or specialized foster care was higher than re-entries into all placement types. Re-entry information is to assist in program and service planning only. These data reflect children/youth who may have been in an out of home placement prior to the SOC Networks implementation.





Figure 7. Percent of children entering into out-of-home placement for the first time, by age group and frequent removal reasons, assigned to networks, FY14





Figure 8. Percent of children re-entering into out-of-home placement, by age group and frequent removal reasons, assigned to networks, FY14





Figure 9. Percent of children entering into out-of-home placement for the first time, by age group and most frequent first placement service types of current removal, assigned to networks, FY14










